Ability to work independently, working occasionally outside office hours, and willingness to conduct onsite fieldwork in both Hong Kong and Malaysia are essential for this position. Proficiency in Cantonese is a must because of the nature of the fieldwork.

Applicants should have a Bachelor's degree in Sociology, cultural studies or related disciplines, with knowledge of conducting quantitative analyses of large-scale dataset. Ability to and experiences in writing academically will be an advantage. The appointee will also be occasionally required to perform duties in non-regular hours.
