The appointee(s) will participate in online and/or in-person activities related to teaching; research projects for knowledge transfer; curriculum and programme development; development of teaching and learning materials; practicum supervision and programme and course management. Field work may also be required.

Applicants should have a Doctoral degree (EdD or PhD) with substantial post-qualification teaching experience, preferably in special education or counselling or psychology or a relevant subject discipline, and preferably possess a relevant professional teaching certificate (e.g., PGDE) or qualification of Qualified Teacher Status (QTS) recognized by the Education Bureau of Hong Kong or equivalent qualifications.

Applicants with experience in one or more of the following areas will have an added advantage: front-line teaching in supporting students with SEN in ordinary or special school settings; teaching experience related to special education at the tertiary level; and demonstrated competence in digital pedagogy, e-learning, and AI-enhanced teaching and learning for SEN.
