This 5-year project aims to develop an online adaptive learning system for secondary schools. The appointee will assist in duties related to platform development, and performing any other duties as assigned. The initial appointment period will be 6 months and may be extended upon mutual agreement.

For the post of Senior Research Assistant, applicants should hold a Master's degree in Computer Science or a related discipline, plus at least one year of full-time post-master's work experience, or a doctoral degree.

For the post of Research Assistant I, applicants should possess a Bachelor's or Master's degree in Computer Science or a related discipline.

Applicants must be able to multi-task, work under tight deadlines, and function effectively both independently and as part of a team. Strong communication skills and the ability to learn independently are essential. Proficiency in Cantonese will be an advantage.
