



Senior Lecturer II / Lecturer I / Lecturer II (Ref: 2600440) National Security and Legal Education Research Centre

The National Security and Legal Education Research Centre invites applications for a fixed-term appointment as Senior Lecturer II, Lecturer I, or Lecturer II. The appointment will support the Centre's teaching, programme development, professional training, public education, and outreach work in the areas of Constitutional Law, the Basic Law, National Security Law, legal education, digital governance, and related areas of public law. Renewal of appointment will be subject to satisfactory performance, operational needs, and the availability of funding.

Applicants are expected to have relevant university-level teaching experience, demonstrated subject expertise, and strong pedagogical competence in Law. The appointee will support the Centre's work in promoting national security and legal education through taught courses, Master of Laws programmes, professional development courses, seminars, conferences, school outreach, community collaboration, and other education-related activities.

Duties may be carried out during the daytime, in the evening, or occasionally at weekends, depending on programme and event needs. The appointee should be able to teach and conduct academic or professional activities in English, Cantonese, and Putonghua/Mandarin.

Senior Lecturer II

- Applicants should normally possess a Master's degree in Law, with a minimum of eight years of relevant post-qualification teaching, professional, or related experience in law or legal education. A doctoral degree in Law is preferred.
- Applicants for this rank should provide strong evidence of high-quality teaching at the tertiary or professional level. They should also be able to take a more senior role in course leadership, programme development, professional training, mentoring, academic administration, and Centre-level activities. Experience in leading or coordinating courses, supervising teaching teams, developing curricula, or engaging with schools, legal institutions, government bodies, or professional organisations will be an advantage.

Lecturer I

- Applicants should possess a Master's degree in Law, with a minimum of four years of relevant post-qualification teaching, professional, or related experience in law or legal education. A doctoral degree in Law is preferred.
- Applicants for this rank should provide evidence of quality teaching and/or a proven record of successful and relevant professional experience at the tertiary, professional, or education-sector level. They should be able to teach independently, support course and programme coordination, contribute to curriculum and teaching material development, and assist in the Centre's seminars, professional training, outreach, and event-related work.

Lecturer II

- Applicants should possess a Master's degree in Law. A doctoral degree in Law is preferred. Applicants with less relevant post-qualification teaching or professional experience may be considered for this position.
- Applicants for this rank should demonstrate strong subject knowledge, good teaching potential, and the ability to support the Centre's courses, programmes, and events. They should be able to assist in tutorial teaching, preparation of teaching materials, assessment support, student learning support, academic administration, professional training activities, and Centre outreach events under appropriate guidance.

Salary will be commensurate with qualifications and experience.

Initial appointment will be made on a fixed-term contract. Fringe benefits include the University's Voluntary Contributions to MPF Scheme or a contract-end lump sum payment (totaling up to 10% of the basic salary for the position of Lecturer I and Lecturer II, and totaling up to 15% of the basic salary for the position of Senior Lecturer II), leave, medical and dental benefits, and, where applicable, housing benefits.
