The appointee will assist in research projects by leading the qualitative aspects of the study, including data collection, analysis, and academic writing. They will contribute to the planning and implementation of research activities to ensure they align with project objectives and protocols. The appointee will manage and transform unstructured field data into analyzable formats, conduct qualitative analysis, and perform basic statistical analysis when needed. They will also support the research team with literature reviews, the drafting of methodology and results sections, and the preparation of academic publications. The role requires strong analytical skills, attention to detail, and the ability to extract meaningful insights from complex, real-world settings.

Requirements:

- Applicants should have at least Level 2 or equivalent or above in five subjects, including Chinese Language, English Language, and Mathematics in HKDSE; or Grade E (Level 2) or above in five subjects, including Chinese, English (Syllabus B), and Mathematics in HKCEE or equivalent;
- A Bachelor's degree or a Master's degree in Social Sciences, Psychology, Public Health, Gerontology, Urban Studies, or a related discipline will be an advantage;
- Strong ability to identify research opportunities and capture meaningful data through observation and engagement. Experience in participatory or field-based qualitative research is highly preferred;
- Proficiency in qualitative analysis software (e.g., NVivo) and the ability to conduct basic statistical analysis (e.g., using SPSS or Python); and
- Excellent interpersonal and communication skills to work effectively with team members and external partners. Proficiency in written and spoken English and Cantonese.

Salary will be commensurate with qualifications and experience. Fringe benefits include leave and outpatient medical benefits.
