Project Title: HKJC Project - Strengthening Physical Literacy for Preschoolers Project

[Appointment Period: 24 months]

The appointee will be responsible for supporting a project that aims to promote physical literacy among kindergarten children in Hong Kong and enhance teachers' efficacy in delivering quality physical activity and movement-related learning experiences in preschool settings.

The appointee will contribute to the implementation and evaluation of project activities. Major duties include supporting data collection and project evaluation activities; conducting quantitative and/or qualitative analyses of project data; preparing scientific manuscripts for publication in peer-reviewed journals; developing conference presentations, reports, and other dissemination materials; assisting in the interpretation and reporting of research findings; coordinating with project partners and stakeholders on research-related matters; and performing any other duties as assigned by the supervisors. The post will require travel to kindergartens and other venues across Hong Kong for data collection and project-related activities.

Applicants should have a Doctoral Degree in Early Childhood Education, Sport Science, Physical Education, Public Health, or a related discipline. They should demonstrate excellent analytical, organisational, and communication skills. They should be self-motivated, capable of working independently as well as collaboratively in a multidisciplinary team, and able to manage multiple tasks effectively. Applicants should be proficient in both written and spoken English and Chinese. A strong publication record in peer-reviewed journals will be an advantage.

Salary will be commensurate with qualifications and experience.

Initial appointment will be made on a fixed-term contract. Fringe benefits include contract-end gratuity, leave, medical and dental benefits.
