The appointee will provide administrative support to the project. The appointee will be responsible for reviewing literature, collecting data, analyzing data and drafting reports. The appointee will also coordinate activities facilitating the dissemination of research findings, and perform other duties as assigned by the Principal Investigator. The appointment will be for a period of 11 months, with the possibility of renewal subject to mutual agreement. The start date will be negotiable, ideally September 2, 2026, or soon as thereafter.

Applicants should have a Master's degree, preferably in Social Science, Psychology, Education or related disciplines, plus one-year's post Master's Degree full-time working experience, or a Doctoral degree. They should demonstrate experience in research design and implementation, and competence in quantitative and/or qualitative methods. Evidence of academic writing, including publications or contribution to peer-reviewed outputs, is preferred. Familiar with the Hong Kong education system or related contexts will be an advantage. Applicants should demonstrate the ability to work both independently with initiatives and effectively as part of a collaborative research team.
