Project Title: Towards Precision Psychiatry: Building Transdiagnostic Prediction Model From Neurophysiological Pattern For ADHD Children
[Appointment Period: 12 months]

We are seeking a Research Assistant for a 12-month appointment to work on the project "Towards Precision Psychiatry: Building Transdiagnostic Prediction Model from Neurophysiological Pattern for ADHD Children." This project examines EEG-based neurophysiological markers of cognitive functioning and treatment response in children with ADHD. The successful candidate will be primarily responsible for day-to-day project management and participant-facing data collection, including recruitment and screening of ADHD and typically developing children through collaborating hospitals and NGOs, liaison with parents, clinical partners, and NGO service providers, scheduling and coordinating testing sessions, administering EEG recordings, cognitive tasks and neurofeedback sessions with child participants, administering parent-rated questionnaires, managing consent forms and participant records, and preparing progress reports for the research team.

Applicants should possess a Bachelor's degree in Psychology, Education, Special Education, Social Work, or a related discipline. Essential requirements include good written and spoken English and Chinese, including Cantonese. Prior experience working with kindergarten-aged children and/or children with special educational needs (SEN) is essential for this post. Experience working with children with ADHD, or in clinical/healthcare settings involving child assessment or behavioural support, is highly desirable. The ideal candidate should be patient and skilled in engaging young children during testing, with strong organisational and interpersonal skills for coordinating recruitment and liaising with hospital and NGO partners as well as parents. Experience in human participant research or project coordination would be an advantage, though extensive data analysis or task programming skills are not required for this role. We are looking for someone self-motivated, responsible, detail-oriented, and capable of working independently and as part of a team.
