Renowned Writer of Children Literature Mr Chu Pu Sun (A Nong)

Famous by his pen name A Nong, the well-known children's author is less well known by his real name, Chu Pu Sun. Mr Chu graduated in 1954 from Grantham Training College. He is a veteran teacher with 39 years experience. He had taught in both primary and secondary schools. In 1984, Mr Chu took up the challenge of joining a school admitting children with serious emotional problems, where he served for nine years. In the meantime, he studied Special Education at Sir Robert Black College of Education. Mr Chu was a member of the Executive Committee and Senate of the Hong Kong Professional Teachers' Union.

Mr Chu is a prolific writer, well-loved and admired by young people. His passion for education is apparent from the many books he has authored. He is widely acclaimed in the world of children's literature. He has published more than 100 books, winning many awards, including "Bing Xin Children Literature Award 2004" (winning book: "Tenderness in My Heart"), "Third Hong Kong Biennial Children Literature Award" (winning book: "Story-telling by A Nong"), "Hong Kong Education City Top Ten Good Books 2004" (Top Choice) and "My Favourite Writer Award" (winning book: "Diary of the Fair Maiden"). Mr Chu was also named five times as their best loved author by secondary school students.

While enjoying his life in retirement in Canada, Mr Chu is still active creatively. He continues to meet young people, listening to their stories and sharing with them his experiences of life. His passion for education still motivates him to keep on writing for his readers.

Enthusiastic Educationist Mr Stephen Hui Chin Yim, MH

A committed and experienced educationist, Mr Stephen Hui Chin Yim has been dedicating in fostering the development of education in Hong Kong. He taught at CCC Ming Yin College for over 23 years from 1969 to 1992. After that, he was the Principal of CCC Ming Kei College, where he worked for 15 years.

Mr Hui has been Adjunct Associate Professor of HKIEd School of Continuing Professional Education since November 2008. Currently, he is the Director of Education Services of the Hong Kong Council of the Church of China in Hong Kong.

Mr Hui has participated in social service and education bodies since the 1990s. He has been Deputy Chairman of the Hong Kong Examinations and Assessment Authority since September 2006. He is also a member of the Advisory Committee on Teacher Education and Qualifications.

His service on other education bodies included being a member of the Hong Kong Subsidized Secondary Schools Council (1996 – 1998), Chairman (1998 – 2002), and then ex-officio until 2006, as well as Chairman of the second and third Executive Committees of the Kowloon Region School Heads Association. In recognition of his outstanding contributions and services to the local education sector, he was awarded the Medal of Honour in 2003.

Renowned Entrepreneur and Philanthropist Mr Peter Lee Ting Chang

A renowned entrepreneur and a dedicated philanthropist, Mr Peter Lee Ting-Chang, Chairman of Hysan Development Co. Ltd., has been a devoted supporter of education. Mr Lee was a Council Member of Hong Kong's Education Commission between 1993 and 1998. He is currently an international council member of the business school INSEAD in France. As a Governor of the Lee Hysan Foundation, Mr Lee has helped to provide sustained and substantial support to local universities.

In 1993, Mr Lee became a member of the Provisional Governing Council formed to set up the HKIEd. He was also Chairman of its Finance Committee. Mr Lee was a founding council member of HKIEd and served on the Council for nine years (1994 - 2003). He was also the Institute's first Treasurer from 1994 to 2002. Mr Lee's outstanding contributions to the various aspects of the Institute have laid a solid foundation for the Institute's ongoing development and growth.

Mr Lee is also currently an independent non-executive director of a number of Hong Kong companies, including Cathay Pacific Airways, CLP Group, Hang Seng Bank, Maersk China, SCMP Group, and a director of other local companies. He has also taken on active roles in business organisations and in public service. He is a Vice President of the Real Estate Developers Association of Hong Kong; a Council Member of various business advisory bodies; an Advisory Board Member and the Chairman of the Administration Advisory Committee of the Salvation Army – Hong Kong; and a Council/Advisory Member of a number of other international and local civic or cultural organisations.

Veteran Educator Mr Leo Lu Kwong Fai

Mr Leo Lu Kwong Fai has dedicated his life to education in Hong Kong and Mainland China. He graduated from Sir Robert Black College of Education in 1961, and later served as Headmaster of CCC Kei Luen Primary School, CCC Kei Leung Primary School, CCC Kei Kok Primary School, and CCC Ho Fuk Tong Primary School before retirement in 2001.

Mr Lu is currently Chairman of the Rural Schools Rebuilding Project in China of The Amity Foundation. Since retirement, Mr Lu has dedicated his efforts to helping under-privileged students in rural areas of China, mainly in north-western and south-western areas, by rebuilding schools. He donated HK\$500,000 from his retirement fund to support reconstruction of collapsing schools in the Mainland. Over the past 10 years, Mr Lu has assisted in reconstruction of hundreds of collapsing schools, enabling thousands of students to go back to school each year.

Mr Lu is the Chairman of Sir Robert Black College of Education Past Students Association. He has often supported the HKIEd with donations of his works for fundraising and organisation of various experience-sharing activities with students. Mr Lu shared his valuable insight and teaching experiences with students of the new generation in his previous photo exhibitions of post-quake Sichuan and talks on his voluntary works in rural China held at HKIEd
