Mr Pang Yiu-kai, HKIEd Council Chairman, presided over the 2014 Honorary Fellowship Presentation Ceremony held at the Tai Po campus today (25 March).

The Honorary Fellowships were conferred on the occasion of the Institute's 20th anniversary – a milestone symbolising the Institute's growth and development built on more than 160 years of education heritage. Professor Stephen Cheung Yan-leung, HKIEd President, commented that "as we celebrate our 20th anniversary, we are particularly pleased to pay tribute to these distinguished individuals who have made contributions to Hong Kong at different stages of their lives in areas including education, sports development and social work".

"For some of them, their personal interests in music and Chinese opera, and their devotion to promoting arts education and sporting activities, have helped enrich the cultural life and enhance the soft power and people quality of our city", he added.

"I would dare say that this is in no small measure due to the contribution of our teachers and teacher education, in which HKIEd plays a pivotal role", said Professor Cheung.

In celebration of its 20th anniversary, the Institute will stage a wide array of activities, ranging from academic conferences and a distinguished leader dialogue series to concerts and alumni and community events, among others. Expressing his anticipation of these reflective occasions, Professor Cheung said that he also has every confidence in the Institute retaining a distinctive role in the years to come.
