The Council welcomed Miss LYU Chengao, the Observer, to the Meeting.

2. Vote of Thanks

The Council recorded a vote of thanks to Miss Gemma STICHON, the former Student Council Member, for her outstanding service and contributions to the University for the past year.

3. Report from the Staffing Committee

The Council noted the major Human Resources issues that the Staffing Committee had endorsed / approved / noted via circulation of paper in March to May 2025 and at its meeting held on 25 February 2025 and 2 June 2025 and approved:

- (i) the proposed Medical and Dental Benefits Scheme for 2025/26 and beyond, along with the enhancements;
- (ii) the three-year re-engagement for a Chair Professor who will have surpassed the extended retirement age of 65 either at the start or during the proposed re-engagement contract;
- (iii) the preliminary proposal for PBRS 2025; and
- (iv) the proposed leave enhancements and the alignment of service eligibility for Family-friendly Leave.

4. Report from The Education University of Hong Kong Foundation

The Council noted the report and approved the re-appointment of Prof Terence CHAN Howah, as a Member of the Board of Stewards of The EdUHK Foundation for another term of three years, retroactively effective from 24 June 2025.

11. Senior Management Report

The Council noted the activities and development of the University since the last Council Meeting, including:

(i) Overall developments

- unveils Strategic Plan 2025-2031: 'Education Futures';
- ranked 530th QS World University Rankings 2026 and 633th in US News Best Global Universities Rankings, excelling in key academic areas;
- Flag-raising Ceremony held for 10th National Security Education (NSE) Day and a series of NSE activities collaborated with District Offices;
- signed an MOU with China Foreign Affairs University to establish the Institute for International Relations, enhancing international relations and Chinese foreign affairs education in Hong Kong in March 2025;
- collaborated with Harvard University and Stanford University for symposium on emerging technologies and future talents;
- the University and Tsinghua University hosted a forum on AI's impact on future education in June 2025;
- announced Prof Xu Bing's appointment and launched the 'Where Sky and Earth Meet' programme;
- hosted the 'Chinese Martial Arts and Culture Symposium', featuring guest speakers and AR Tai Chi experiences for 500 participants; and
- symposium established educational cooperation between Xinjiang Normal University and Central Asian universities in May 2025;

(ii) Academic developments

- updates on admissions for the 2025 entry;
- Faculty Information Day 2025 successfully attracted 700 participants with additional non-local admissions talks.
- UGC confirmed the UKPI related to English language competency;
- collaborated with Qufu Normal University to conduct a seminar on educators' professional ethics, focusing on cultivation on ethical standards and future challenges;
- symposium on 'Education and Social Development in GBA Area: Policies, Trend, and Challenges' held in April 2025;
- signed MoU with eleven Mainland schools for collaboration;

- the 3rd AIREA AI and Education Forum was held in May 2025 at Central China Normal University in Wuhan, focusing on AI's impact in education, featuring keynote speeches and a panel discussion with over 300 attendees;
- The International Conference on Learning and Teaching 2025, hosted by the University in May 2025 in hybrid format, featured over 200 submissions on future readiness, six thematic strands, and five keynote speakers;
- the University and EdCity held a successful AI Symposium for K-12 education in May 2025, with over 250 attendees;
- two seminars on Zhuangzi and Confucianism held in April and May 2025, attracting 213 participants; and
- the Centre for Classical Chinese Education launched a Certificate Programme with 33 students enrolled, expanding collaborations with schools;

(iii) Research developments

- EduData Summit 2025 held in Singapore focused on AI, data science, skills and innovation in education;
- the RGC delegation visited the University in June 2025, discussing the University's new Education Futures approach and recent research developments;
- University-level research centres increasing to a total number of three;
- seven research projects won nine awards;
- three venture capital firms meeting the startups of the University in March 2025;
- the startups attended pre-selection at Guangdong University of Technology, gaining insights; and
- a CPO-conducted survey identified 28 active EdUHK startups, highlighting key findings regarding their support needs;

(iv) Student Activities and Support Services

- Hong Kong PHD Fellowship Scheme 2025/26: 23 nominations, 14 fellowships awarded;
- 62 students joined International Outreach Study Programme, including symposia;
- students of the University and CUHK participated in an innovation and entrepreneurship tour in Guangzhou;
- Hong Kong SAR Government initiated Hong Kong Future Talents Scholarship Scheme for Advanced Studies to support local students in strategic study areas for Hong Kong development; and UGC approved 17 EdUHK postgraduate programmes; and
- Belt & Road Conference on Special Education 2025 gathered nearly 200 scholars and educators from Asia, discussing advancing education, diverse learning approaches, and integrating AI and EdTech in special education;

(v) Administrative developments

- enhancement in the IT infrastructure and cybersecurity of the University;
- update on AA&I projects and environmental initiatives;
- New Campus Access Arrangement, effective March 2025, requires departmental events with external guests to gain endorsements for security;
- campus sustainability initiatives include the set-up of smart recycling bins, beverage carton collection, and the installation of electric vehicle chargers;
- transportation service studies for Northwest New Territories are ongoing with KMB service enhancements planned for the new semester; and
- a new study centre at M+ Building in West Kowloon Cultural District is tentatively scheduled to start operation in first quarter of 2026.
