Chair Professors / Professors / Associate Professors

Applicants for Professorship are expected to have a strong publication record, leadership experience, an international reputation and network, and the ability to contribute to collaborative research; applicants for Associate Professorship should be able to demonstrate potential for leadership in research, teaching and service. Candidates will be expected to participate in administrative leadership, to secure external funding, to contribute to the strategic development of academic programmes and associated student practicums, to serve the profession at large, and to teach effectively within the university. Department of Linguistics and Modern Language Studies

Applicants should have a Doctoral Degree in Linguistics or a related discipline. The candidates should preferably have expertise in one or more of the following areas: second language acquisition; grammar and discourse studies; sociolinguistics; world Englishes; and corpus linguistics.

Department of Literature and Cultural Studies

Literature and Cultural Studies, Post 1 (Ref : CPP/LCS/0219)

Applicants should have a Doctoral Degree in literary studies, cultural studies, or another humanities discipline. Applicants' professional experience and research expertise should be in one or more of the following areas: world literature, comparative literature, literature and translation, film and media studies, visual and popular culture.
