Where Sporting and Scholarly **Excellences Come Together**



Known as an 'elite athlete friendly university', EdUHK lends crucial support to elite athletes through its flexible learning arrangements, enabling them to excel in both sport and scholarship. Take Mak Cheuk-wing, Hong Kong women sailing's representative who earned the city's firstever gold at the **U15 world championship** in windsurfing at the **Techno 293** at the mere age of 13. On top of intensive training that targets at the Olympics, she pursues studies in physical education at the University, hoping to become a physical education teacher in future and instilling in children a love for sport and an active lifestyle. A keen sportswoman, the four-time winner of the Hong Kong Outstanding Youth Athlete award is a member of the University's basketball and soccer teams, and she has got her first taste of contact rugby at EdUHK and gone on to represent Hong Kong in Britain's Super Seven Series.

Widening Horizons

True to its eclectic ethos, the EdUHK campus welcomed more than a hundred students from 25 partner institutions hailing from mainland China, Korea, the Netherlands, Norway, Russia, Saudi Arabia and Britain in July and August 2025, with them joining the University's debut four-week summer programme on AI and Hong Kong culture. Study aside, they toured around the city, strolling through the streets and calling on its museums and landmarks, whilst attending art and cultural workshops, where they tried their hands at making traditional Chinese kites and local minibus signs.

In the meantime, our homegrown students were having their handsome share of mind-blowing experiences, with 10 of them taking up the challenge this summer to learn the beautiful yet highly sophisticated Arabic, through taking part in the four-week intensive programme at Umm Al-Qura University in Saudi Arabia.

In December 2023, the University founded the Global Research Institute for Finnish Education, which pioneers educational innovation through collaborations with Finnish universities, including Abo Akademi University, University of Helsinki, Tampere University, University of Jyväskylä and others. 




| Strategic Research Cluster Network Graph

Contributing to Sustainable Development

Dedicated to advancing the United Nations' Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs), the University has formed an SDG Task Force that includes members of senior management. In 2024-25 academic year, it approved and allocated funding for five SDG projects.

Promoting Community Well-being and Recycling





One of the projects, the **EdUHK SDG Living Laboratory** @ **Taipo**, promotes community well-being through identifying senior citizens showing signs of declined cognitive functions and referring those at risk of dementia for further treatment. This initiative has also built long-term partnerships with 12 Taipo district council members, eight care teams, and five community organisations, further strengthening its impact by extending educational and health resources to the local community.

To promote the use of clean energy, the University has put in place electric vehicle charging facilities at its Block A carpark and installed solar panels at the covered walkway from Block D4 to E. Through reducing general solid waste in student halls and advocating paperless office, we have sought to reduce waste campus-wide.
