

Read the following extracts from the bible. Then complete Parts A to C.

A. Mark 14:1-9 Jesus announced his death while he was anointed by a woman

- 14:1 It was now two days before the feast of the Passover and the unleavened bread, and the chief priests and the scribes sought how they might seize him by deception, and kill him.
- 14:2 For they said. "Not during the feast, because there might be a riot of the people.
- 14.3 While he was at Bethany, in the house of Simon me leper, as he sat at the table, a woman came having an alabaster jar of ointment of pure nard very costly. She broke the jar, and poured it over his head.
- 14.4 But mere were some that had indignation among themselves, saying, and "Why has this ointment been wasted
- 14.5 For this might have been sold for more than three hundred silver coins, and the money given to the poor." They grumbled against her.
- 14:6 But Jesus said, "Leave her alone. Why do you trouble her'.'¹ She has done a good work for me
- 14:7 For you always have the poor with you, and whenever you want to, you can do them good; but you will not always have me.
- 14:8 She has done what she could. She has anointed my body beforehand for the burying.
- 14.9 Most assuredly I tell you, wherever this gospel may be preached throughout the whole world, that also which this woman has done will be spoken of for a memorial of her."

B. Mark 14:12-16 Preparation of the Passover meal

- 14.12 On the first day of unleavened bread, when they sacrificed the Passover, his disciples asked him, "Where do you want us to go and make ready mat you may eat the Passover?"
- 14:13 He sent two of his disciples, and said to them, **"Go into** the city, and there you will meet a man carrying a pitcher of water. Follow him
- 14:14 and wherever he enters in, tell (the master of the house. The Teacher says, "Where is the guest room, where I may eat me Passover with my disciples?"
- 14:15 He will himself show you a large upper room furnished and ready. Make ready for us there."

14:16 His disciples went out, and came into the city, and found things as he had said to them, and they prepared the Passover.

C. Mark 14:43-53 The Arrest

- 14:43 Immediately, while he was still speaking, Judas, one of the twelve, came –and with him a multitude with swords and clubs, from the chief priests, the scribes, and the elders.
- 14:44 Now he who betrayed him had given diem a sign, saying," Whomever I will kiss, that is he. Seize him, and lead him away safely.
- 14:45 When he had come, immediately he came to him, and said, "Rabbi! Rabbi!" and kissed him.
- 14:46 They laid their hands on him, and seized him.
- 14:47 But a certain one of those who stood by drew his sword, and struck the servant of the high priest, and cut off his ear.
- 14:48 Jesus answered them; "Have you come out, as against a robber, with swords and clubs to seize me?
- 14:49 I was daily with you in the temple teaching, and you didn't arrest me. But this is so that the Scriptures might be fulfilled."
- 14:50 They all left him, and fled.
- 14:51 A certain young man followed with him, having a linen cloth thrown around him.Over his naked body the young men grabbed him,
- 14:52 but he left the linen cloth, and fled from them naked.
- 14:53 They led Jesus away to the high priest. All the chief priests, the elders, and the scribes came together with him.
