

 - Strand 1: Persons, Interpretations, Perspectives
 - Strand 2: Community, Society, Culture
 - Strand 3: Nature, Science, Technology
- 2. Positive and Values Education Course (3 cps)
- 3. General Education Interdisciplinary Course (3 cps)
