Aebersold's Mediated Play-A-Long Pedagogy and the
Invention of the Beginning Jazz Improvisation Student

A. Briefly introduce your research output/publication for which you have received the prize.

My output, "Aebersold's Mediated Play-A-Long Pedagogy and the Invention of the Beginning Jazz Improvisation Student," published in the *Journal of Research in Music Education*, covers the history of one of the most consequential learning technologies: the jazz Play-A-Long. Based on a set of oral histories with Jamey Aebersold and others who pioneered and refined the Play-A-Long form, I document how the Play-A-Long helped to establish a set of stable ideas for what a beginning jazz musician should be at a time where improvisation pedagogy was in its infancy. The work documents how repeated listening, the concept of chord-based scales, the applied process of learning by soloing, and the arranging of material from simple to complex took place from the late 1960s to the present. I also document Aebersold's debt to Black music theory and pedagogy through the ideas of George Russell and David Baker, which helps to further establish the contributions of Black musicians.

B. How you used/will use your prize and perhaps its usefulness to your research development?

I plan to purchase a new laptop computer for teaching and research purchases, one capable of using and supporting use of Play-A-Long materials in class demonstrations and workshops. I also plan for an overseas trip, with the remainder of time to be used for student research assistance.

C. Expected research outcomes/outputs/impacts arising from this prize.

I expect to continue to document the Play-A-Long as a tool for learning to help those promoting the teaching of musical creativity and improvisation. I plan to produce a subsequent study on the aesthetics and pedagogy of the Play-A-Long form, which I hope to submit within this year to a top journal in music education.
