Full-time appointment is for a period of 10 months with expected start date in July 2021. Please specify in your application if you are applying for a Full-time, Part-time, or both positions. Applications will be reviewed on a rolling basis.

Applicant should have a Bachelor's degree in Psychology or a related discipline. Preference will be given to those with experience in supporting research and using statistical software (SPSS, R) in data analysis, and proficiency in both English and Chinese.
