<u>Action</u>

1. Welcome and Introduction

- 1.1 The Programme Leader (PL) welcomed the student representatives/participants and invited them to make comments on any matters related to the programme.
- 1.2 Prior to the meeting, participants have made comments and suggestions on the programme through an online survey.

2. Participants' Comments and Feedback

2.1 Student Learning Experience

2.1.1 Participants expressed that the learning experiences in the Master of Teaching Progemme (MTeach) were good and the courses of MTeach fulfilled their learning expectations.

2.1.2 Participants suggested the programme to provide more practice opportunities. The Programme Leader (PL) replied that the Programme Team would try to provide more practice opportunities. He emphasized that MTeach was an integration of theories and practice and would benefit students in the future.

2.2 Programme Structuire

2.2.1 Participants suggested having a variety of elective courses for selection to meet the diverse learning needs of participants. PL replied that the Programme Team would continue to communicate with relevant faculties and departments to see if more courses could be offered in different specialisations.

2.2.2 Full-time participants expressed their preference in having classes in daytime. The PL replied that MTeach accepted both full-time and part-time students so classes would be held on weekday evenings and Saturdays.

2.3 Learning and Teaching

2.3.1 Participants appreciated that most of the course lecturers could upload course materials on Moodle a few days before each lecture, so that they would have sufficient time for preparation. Participants requested that the course lecturer of Special Topics in Language Communication [CHI6524] could upload readings in advance. PL would forward the comments to the lecturer concerned for consideration.

- 2.3.2 Participants consulted the PL about study skills. The PL recommended participants to read the course materials before each lecture; find study partners and ask for course lecturers' guidance on completing their assignments.
- 2.3.3 The PL informed the participants that both English Phonetics and Phonology [ENG6212] and Literature and Language Arts in TESOL [ENG6360] would not be cross listed with MA Programme in Teaching English to Speakers of Other Languages (MATESOL) in Semester 2, 2016/17. The class size of these two courses would be reduced and benefit students.
- 2.3.4 Participants suggested that course lecturers of MTeach could show students videos about real teaching scenes in Hong Kong. Under lecturers' guidance, students could analyze and learn how to apply different teaching skills. PL would forward the comments to lecturers of MTeach for consideration.

- 2.3.5 Participants appreciated the course lecturer of Teaching Strategies for Enhancing Student Learning [TLS6036] in teaching.
- 2.3.6 Participants appreciated the course lecturer of Methods in Research for Learning [PRJ6002] for his presentation skills and making scientific / complicated contents easy to understand. PL will convey students' comments to the lecturer concerned.

- 2.3.7 Participants concerned about the arrangements for Practitioner-based Research Project [PRJ6003]. The PL replied that allocation of supervisors and partnership schools would be announced once confirmed. The PL advised participants to read the Handbook for PRJ6003 thoroughly and attend a series of four workshops on SPSS exclusively for MTeach students.
- 2.3.8 Some participants expressed their interests in courses of Special Education Specialisation (SPE) and asked if they could take a few related courses even they were not studying under SPE. The PL replied that participants would learn how to cater for students' diverse needs in inclusive mainstream classrooms in MTeach Core Course Learning in the Inclusive Classroom [SED6043] in Semester 2, 2016/17.
- 2.4 Programme Administration
- 2.4.1 Participants considered that the programme administration was responsive.
- 2.5 Resources Support
- 2.5.1 Participants considered that the library support was good.
- 2.5.2 The PL suggested that participants could check the university / email announcements frequently and signed up for the workshops, seminars and activities organized by different units of the University and the Chinese Students and Scholars Association (CSSA) etc., to make new friends and enhance their language skills.
