Why taking risks?

- The enemy of risk-taking is maintaining the status quo even when it mal-functions
- Greenleaf's three institutional maladies
- To tackle them is to take risks: challenge the status quo, leave the comfort zone, strive for a new direction and state -uncharted territory; full of uncertainty and anxiety
- Institutional & personal benefits: growth, development and excellence (self-actualization, self-transcendence, and maximum use of potential/talents to serve and to serve well)

What risks to take

- Related to the school's problems and maladies: institutional before personal benefits
- Calculated risks Vs reckless risks taken on a whim
- Bold or audacious Vs small or simple goals

How to take risks

- Calculation Vs recklessness
- Risk-taking and change leadership & management: requires mind-set & skills-set - reflection, survey, consultation, coalition-building, visioning, planning, training & support, constructing security platforms, implementation, rewards and incentives, evaluation & consolidation, institutionalization
- Lots of thinking and prayers
- Live with the anxiety of failure or loss: what scares you most? Honest to yourself

Jesus' model

- Jesus challenges the status quo and defy the traditions and rituals - hypocrisy
- > He provides the new wine and wineskin
- The greatest risk He took: chose to be born into the world; went towards and finally into Jerusalem to face death on the cross and give life to many afterwards

How to nurture the quality

- > Do something new or unfamiliar from time to time
- Often ask the 'why not' and 'what if' questions
- Try to find alternatives or the third option: another angle, perspective, practice or solution (option)
- Learn to confront and live in peace with fear/anxiety
- Remind yourself of this: no pain, no gain; no risk, no innovation or solution
- Learn from errors and mistakes: their nature (trial-and error or deliberate) and relations to success (fail towards success)
- Trying to accomplish the church's education mission in today's contexts is in itself great risk-taking and it takes lots of calculated risks
