Accreditation Authority

Functions

- To develop and implement the standards and mechanism for academic or vocational accreditations
- To determine whether a qualification from a learning programme offered by a non-self-accrediting operator can meet a certain QF standard
- To determine whether an assessment agency is competent to perform assessments under the Recognition of Prior Learning (RPL) scheme



QR Authority

Function

• To develop and maintain the Qualifications Register (QR)

Power

- To determine the entry or removal of a qualification onto/from the QR
- To ensure and enhancing the credibility of the QR structure
- To monitor advertisements relating to the QF



Qualifications Framework (HKQF)

- The Hong Kong Qualifications Framework (HKQF) is a 7-level hierarchy covering qualifications in the academic, vocational and continuing education
- Qualifications recognised under HKQF are qualityassured and level-rated in accordance with objective and well-defined standards
- QF aim to promote lifelong learning with the objective of enhancing competitiveness of the local workforce




Qualifications Register (QR)

- A free for access on-line database of qualifications that provides information on qualifications, the associated programmes and providers
- Cover qualifications of academic, vocational and continuing education sectors, as well as non-local qualifications
- All qualifications listed on the QR are qualityassured and recognised under the Hong Kong Qualifications Framework (QF)
- As of Oct 2016, there are 7,853 qualifications published on the QR offered by 239 operators






Number of qualifications on QR by QF Level





Qualifications on QR as of October 2016




4,814 qualifications of a wide range of disciplines at different QF levels are quality-assured by **HKCAAVQ**
