WHAT STUDENTS FOUND HELPFUL FOR LEARNING IN EMI LESSONS

The following tips draw on the project *Enhancement of student learning in courses* with English as a medium of instruction (EPL-TEIF-01 & 03; PI: Choi, Tae-Hee), for which Dr. Yuen Wai Kwan Gail and I conducted surveys and interviews.

I. Preparation for lessons: Learning materials

- 1. Aids in understanding
 - Present key concepts and terms in both Chinese and English in handouts and PowerPoint slides
 - Provide a reading guide with questions on main ideas
 - Highlight key things to be learned and review them at the end
- 2. Catching and maintaining attention
 - Use of multimedia
 - A handout with blanks for students to fill in (e.g., key words)
- 3. More autonomy
 - Providing access to PowerPoint slides and course materials of the previous academic semester/year may give a head start to those who want to

II. During lessons: Classroom language and activities

- 1. Simple language
 - Plain language in short sentences with simple structures (e.g. avoiding complex sentences, jargon and pronouns).
 - Give examples
- 2. Utilization of mother tongue
 - If possible, provide key concepts verbally in both Chinese and English
 - Allow group discussion in Chinese
- 3. Activities
 - More discussion/interactive group work sessions
 - Tasks which can check students' learning (e.g. jigsaw reading, 1 minute summary)

III. Assessment: Academic writing

- 1. In-class formative feedback on their writing assignments (e.g., organization of ideas), either by the instructor or peers
- 2. Provision of sample assignments for modelling
