

Research Assistant I (Part-time) (Ref: RAI(PT)/CEDS/0720) Centre for Educational and Developmental Sciences

The Education University of Hong Kong invites suitable applicants for the position of Research Assistant (Part Time) for the project of "A multi-disciplinary study on the roles of Pedagogy and Parents in Children's Developmental and Educational Trajectories."

One in five people in Hong Kong lives in poverty. Both poverty and its associated effects on parental stress have negative impact on children's development. With a rapidly greying population, the need to level the playing field and give our children the education, upbringing, and environment to be the best they can be is more urgent than ever. This project is directed at understanding the development of key childhood outcomes (numeracy, literacy, self-regulation, socio-emotional skills, physical and psychological well-being) with a focus on understanding the interplay between the quality of classroom pedagogy and children's developing capabilities.

The appointee will be responsible for administering standardised psychological and achievement tests in kindergartens and at other locations. The appointee will assist in data entry and project related administrative work. He/she is required to perform any other duties as assigned by the Principal Investigator. The appointment will be for a period of 9 months with possibility of renewal subject to mutual agreement.

Applicants should have a Bachelor's Degree in Psychology, Education, or related subjects. He/she should be experienced in working with kindergarten age children. They should have high proficiency in spoken English and Cantonese. They should also have excellent communication and inter-personal skills. Preference will be given to those who have experience in administering standardised psychological and achievement tests. Experience in conducting psychological or educational research with children will be an advantage. Applicants should be able to work independently and collaboratively in a team environment.
