Part II

The University's Graduate Attributes and seven Generic Intended Learning Outcomes (GILOs) represent the attributes of ideal EdUHK graduates and their expected qualities respectively. Learning outcomes work coherently at the University (GILOs), programme (Programme Intended Learning Outcomes) and course (Course Intended Learning Outcomes) levels to achieve the goal of nurturing students with important graduate attributes.

In gist, the Graduate Attributes for Undergraduate, Taught Postgraduate and Research Postgraduate students consist of the following three domains (i.e. in short "PEER & I"):

- Professional Excellence;
- Ethical Responsibility; &
- Innovation.

The descriptors under these three domains are different for the three groups of students in order to reflect the respective level of Graduate Attributes.

The seven GILOs are:

1. Problem Solving Skills
2. Critical Thinking Skills
3. Creative Thinking Skills
- 4a. Oral Communication Skills
- 4b. Written Communication Skills
5. Social Interaction Skills
6. Ethical Decision Making
7. Global Perspectives

1. Course Synopsis

This course is an advanced research course training students to apply the methodologies they learn into the case studies of Hong Kong and/or global studies. Research Project proposal of 3,000 words will have to be submitted to the supervisor in the first semester, while the entire Research Project of about 15,000 words will have to be delivered to a Research Project committee of two members, including the supervisor. Students will be required to present their Research Project before the Research Project committee, which will then give a grade to the work. Revisions will have to be made so that the final Research Project will satisfy the Research Project committee. The final Research Project will have a copy deposited to the Library and another one in the departmental library.

2. Course Intended Learning Outcomes (CILOs)

Upon completion of this course, students will be able to:

- CILO₁ Demonstrate the ability to master in-depth research on Global and Hong Kong Studies;
- CILO₂ Write a Research Project that combines conceptual and theoretical framework with empirical evidence;

- CILO₄ Display an interpretation of a research topic in a unique manner.
