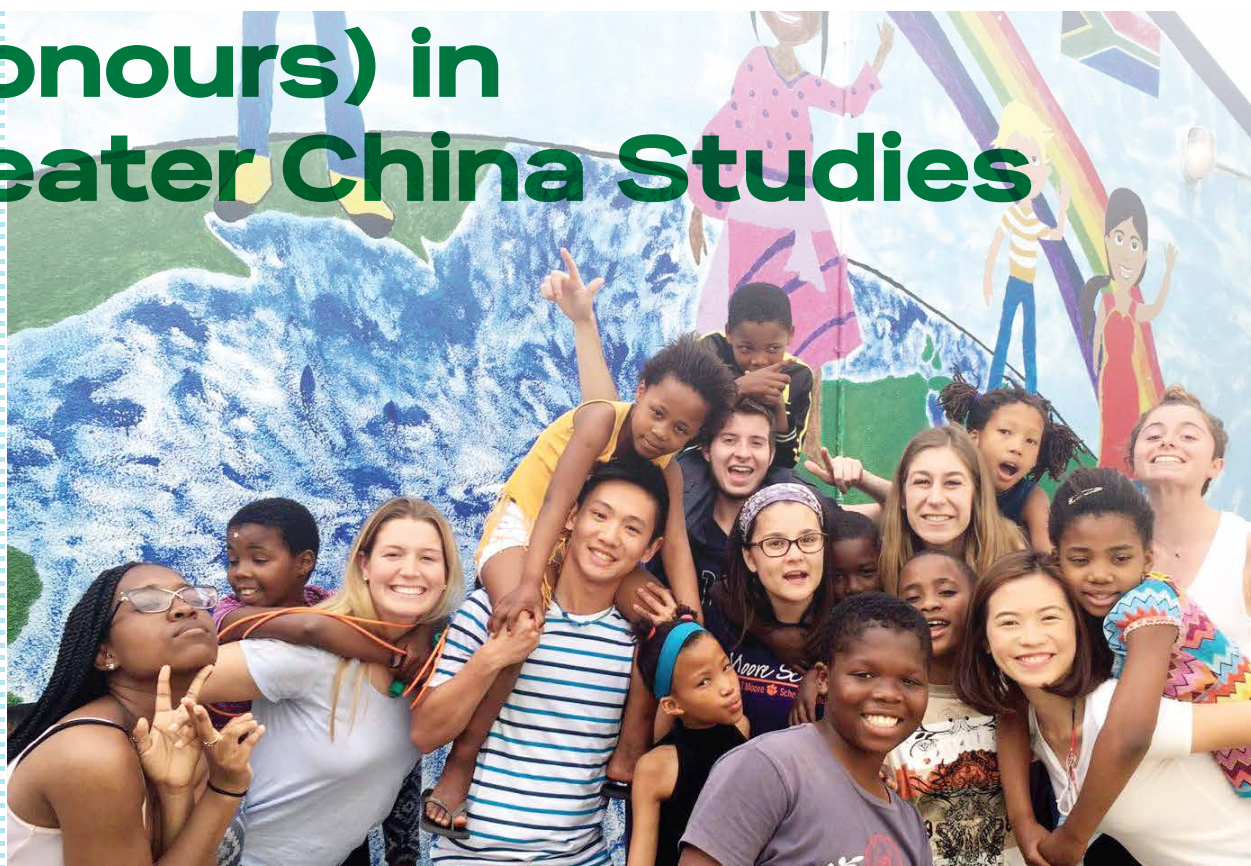

The Bachelor of Social Sciences (Honours) in Greater China Studies [BSocSc(GCS)] encourages students to explore the Greater China region – Hong Kong, Macau, Taiwan, Mainland China and beyond. It arms students with a solid and wide-ranging knowledge on politics, culture, economics and development about the region. Engaging in vibrant academic discussions and hands-on experience in research students are able to identify and solve complex social problems within the context of Greater China, and analyze social issues critically and empirically upon graduation.

Programme Aims

- Enable students to acquire applied methods and analytical skills to critically examine issues from the regional cooperation and competition in a globalised world;
- Provide an overview of social sciences and the disciplines that make up of the social sciences;
- Provide students with knowledge of the dynamics of social transitions in Greater China and comprehensive understanding of regional developments from the comparative and sociological perspectives;

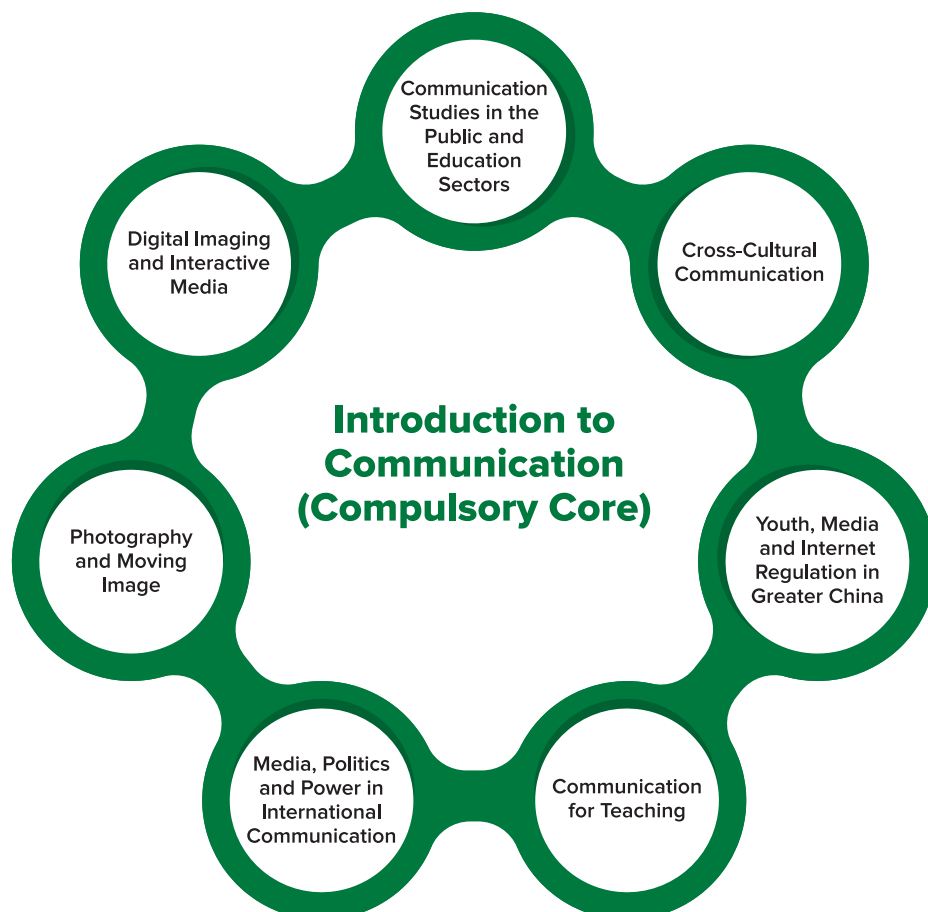

Entrance Requirement

Applicants who have possessed Associate Degree or Higher Diploma qualification awarded by recognised institutions with a good GPA or who are attending final year of a recognised Associate Degree / Higher Diploma programme or equivalent[^] (subject to successful completion of the programme by August with a good GPA) are welcome to apply. Among the key factors where the University will consider admission of an applicant to senior year admissions, including equivalence of the subject discipline of the AD/HD to that of our bachelor's degree programme and the academic performance of the applicant. However, those without relevant academic background will also be considered on an individual basis.

[^] Normally, qualification with is of Level 4 or above under Qualifications Register (QR) of Hong Kong Council for Accreditation of Academic and Vocational Qualifications (HKCAAVQ).

English Language Requirement

- HKDSE Level 2 or above in English Language (applicable to holders of a recognized AD/HD); or
 - IELTS Academic Overall Band 6; or
 - Grade C / Grade 4 or above in IGCSE / GCE OL English; or
 - TOEFL score of 80 (Internet-based); or
 - Other English language qualification deemed acceptable by the University.
